



Office of Emergency Management needs your assistance with mosquito control.

Defend yourself and the City of Lake Worth against the West Nile Virus by taking just a few simple steps.

Just remember the **Four D's**

DUSK / DAWN are the times of day that you should try to stay indoors. This is when infected mosquitoes are most active.

DRESS in long sleeves and pants when you're outside. For extra protection, you may want to spray thin clothing with repellent.

DEET (N,N-diethyl-meta-toluamide) is an ingredient to look for in your insect repellent. Follow the instructions on the label and always wear repellent when outdoors.

DRAIN standing water in your backyard and neighborhood - old tires, flowerpots, and clogged rain gutters. These are mosquito breeding sites.

Fewer than 1% of those bitten by infected mosquitoes become severely ill. If you have symptoms that include stiff neck, high fever, or severe headache, contact your health-care provider immediately.

Cherry Dream Cake

1 package white cake mix (regular size)
 1 package (3 ounces) cherry gelatin
 1-1/2 cups boiling water
 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened
 2 cups whipped topping
 1 can (21 ounces) cherry pie filling



Prepare cake mix according to package directions, using a greased 13x9-inch baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 30-35 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool cake on a wire rack for 3-5 minutes. Poke holes in cake with a meat fork or wooden skewer. Dissolve gelatin in boiling water; gradually pour over cake. Cool for 15 minutes. Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes. In a large bowl, beat cream cheese until fluffy. Fold in whipped topping. Carefully spread over cake. Top with the pie filling. Cover and refrigerate for at least 2 hours before serving.

Yield: 20 servings

Utility Billing Department

November 14 – February 14 is the time frame used to calculate the new sewer charge for residential water accounts. The new rates are effective April's water bill.

If you had a leak during this time frame and have it repaired, you will need to fill out and submit a request for re-consideration of winter sewer average. You can start submitting your request to the utility billing department now through June 30th. Your completed form should be accompanied by proof of the leak being fixed. An acceptable proof of repair includes but is not limited to: a plumber's invoice or store receipt of parts purchased.

Payment options are to pay in person, by mail, or by making a payment through nCourt online or by telephone for an additional fee. All payments received prior to 5:00 pm on a business day will be posted the same day.
